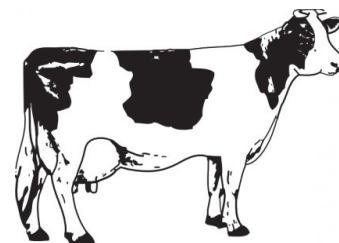

General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this show is responsible for reading and complying with the 4-H & FFA Rules and information section pertaining to the specific project.

Exhibitors will keep their dogs under control at all times. OWNER ASSUMES FULL LIABILITY FOR ANY ACTION OF THEIR DOG(S). The judge will remove from competition any dog that cannot be controlled by its handler. Any handler who interferes willfully with another competitor or dog; and/or any handler who uses excessive force or rough correction with his/her dog will be removed. Exclusion or expulsion is at the discretion of the judge, Dog Superintendent or their designated person. If a dog or handler is expelled or excused by a judge, the reason shall be stated in the judge's report. ALL DECISIONS OF THE JUDGE ARE FINAL. No bitches in season will be allowed.

Rules:

1. All exhibitors' dogs must comply with the health requirements. Rabies certificates and proof of distemper (DHLPP) shots are required. Photocopies of proof of BOTH shots must be turned in with fair entries on July 1st.
2. Dogs that are not registered on an entry form will not be allowed in the show ring.
3. Exhibitors are not permitted to show two dogs in one class. An exhibitor can show more than one dog if they are registered in two different classes.
4. Dogs are to be crated or leashed and kept with the exhibitor at all times.
5. **All exhibitors** must show in **Showmanship AND** obedience or agility.
6. **NO TREATS, TOYS OR BAIT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SHOW OR OBEDIENCE RING. TREATS OR BAIT ARE ALLOWED FOR AGILITY ONLY.**
7. Champion showmanship winners will be eligible to compete in the Small Animal Round Robin immediately following all small animal classes.
8. Clean Fresh Water must be offered to all dogs at least every hour in a clean bowl.
9. Equipment must be appropriate for the class, correct size and in good repair. No prong (pinch) collars, halti (head) collars or flexi leads will be allowed. Max leash length is 6 ft.
10. Closed toe shoes only for all classes. Please wear appropriate showmanship clothing. Girls skirts at or just below knees, or dress slacks, or dark blue/black jeans. Boys should have dress pants or dark blue/black jeans, shirt and tie. Obedience clothing should consist of long pants and nice shirt; polo or button up short sleeve shirts (no t-shirts with sayings) or you may wear your showmanship clothing. Shorts are allowed for agility only. Long hair must be pulled back and bangs kept out of eyes.

Dog Agility Division:

Dog

Beginner—On leash, wearing approved collar. This class is timed.

This is a simple “M”, “S”, or “U” (horseshoe) shaped course consisting of 8 to 11 obstacles.

The following obstacles are used:

- ◆ A-Frame (8 foot apex at 4’0”, 9 foot apex at 4’6”)
- ◆ Pause table (dogs in sit position for 5 cumulative seconds)
- ◆ Open tunnel (2 to 3)
- ◆ Bar Jumps (4 to 6)

Elementary—Off leash, short training tab allowed. This class is timed.

This is a simple “M”, “S”, or “U” (horseshoe) course and consists of 10 – 12 obstacles.

The following obstacles are used:

- ◆ A-frame (8 foot, apex at 4’5”, 9 foot, apex at 5’0”)
- ◆ Pause table: Dog is specified sit or down position for 5 consecutive seconds
- ◆ Open tunnel (2 to 3)
- ◆ Closed tunnel (chute)
- ◆ Dog Walk (at elevation of 24”)
- ◆ Bar Jumps (3 to 5)
- ◆ Broad Jump

Showmanship Classes:

Showmanship will be judged based on the criteria as outlined in the Canine Connection Dog 2 book (page 31) and the Dog Resource Handbook. In summary, the exhibitor will be judged on their ability to handle his/her dog skillfully and to control the dog at all times while in the show ring. General health, cleanliness and grooming of the dog will be judged. Exhibitor’s knowledge of basic dog anatomy, health and care will be judged. Dogs must be shown in proper handling equipment; show collars and show leads. Members should be dressed appropriately for showmanship and be neat and clean. No treats, toys or bait will be allowed in the show ring.

Obedience Classes:

Obedience will be judged based on the criteria as outlined in the Dog Helper’s Guide Book (pages 18-32) and the Dog Resource Handbook. In summary, obedience will be judged on the ability of the exhibitor to have their dog perform a series of exercises for each class as described in the above book. The judge will award points based on the exhibitor’s ability to complete each exercise.

All obedience dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or training collar, being defined as either a flat collar or a slip collar of chain or fabric with one ring at each end. All members competing in obedience must use a 6 foot leather or fabric lead. If you received a blue ribbon in your obedience class at last year’s fair, you must proceed to the next level of obedience. Exception: if an exhibitor has a new dog, they may be allowed to repeat levels at the discretion of the superintendent. No treats, toys or bait will be allowed in the show ring.

Obedience Divisions:

Pre-Novice – Heel on lead; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight; stand for examination; recall, long sit (1 minute), long down (3 minutes) and grooming of dog and handler.

Novice – Heel on and off lead; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight; stand for examination; recall, long sit (1 minute) long down (3 minutes).

Graduate Novice – Heel on and off lead; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight off lead; stand for examination off lead; drop on recall; *dumbbell recall; recall over high jump; recall over broad jump; group exercises of long sit (3 minutes with handler out of sight), long down (5 minutes with handler out of sight).*

Open - Heel off lead; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight off lead; drop on recall; retrieve on flat; retrieve over high jump; broad jump; group exercises of long sit (3 minutes with handler out of sight), long down (5 minutes with handler out of sight).

Graduate Open Class - Signal exercises; scent discrimination; directed retrieve; go out; directed jumping; moving and stand for exam.

Utility— Signal exercises; sent discrimination (Article 1 and 2); directed retrieve; directed jump; moving and stand for examination.

Cloverbud - All exercises performed on leash. Heel, forward, right, left and about turns, automatic sits, figure8, sit for exam, recall, long sit (1 minute).
