SHEAF GRAIN AND GRASSES

(Grain 3 inches beneath head; Grasses 2 inches with blades.)

SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARING A SHEAF FOR THIS EXHIBIT:

All blades should be stripped from the straw except in the clovers. Heads should be well arranged. Straw should be long enough to show average length. Sheaf should be neatly but firmly bound and about three inches in diameter.

REMEMBER that a BUNCH is not a sheaf.
